

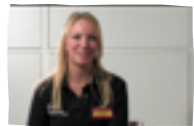
Great Careers! - Jobs without Desks

- long hours during busy periods



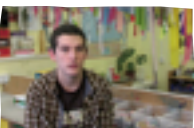

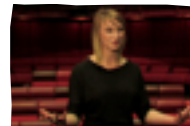

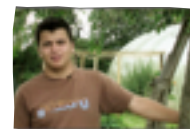
